

Vice President needed for the Miami Valley Miata Club

The MVMC is currently seeking members to self-nominate for Vice President. Previous donation of time that benefitted the MVMC is a plus that will be considered and voted on by the Executive Committee. The VP should possess a passion to serve the MVMC and devotion and time necessary to carry out the duties of president leading the club in 2026.

The VP coordinates with other executive officers and applies the MVMC bylaws to resolve issues that may arise and may serve as a fill-in for the President during his or her absence. Upon election, you will serve the club as VP in 2025 followed by a full one-year term as president beginning Jan 1, 2026. To a certain extent, as VP you will shadow the then current president, so you learn what is expected during your term as president.



To aid in your decision to self-nominate, you should be willing to commit to the following responsibilities when you become President:

- 1. Coordinating Meet & Greet locations, ensuring venue can accommodate members and that it is a generally acceptable restaurant.
- 2. Planning for and leading Executive Committee Meetings held every other month including coordination of date, venue, and agenda items for upcoming club events and general discussions.
- 3. Organizing the club's annual events and delegating assistance from fellow executive officers for the MVMC Picnic/Nominations for the following year's officers, coordinating the voting and ballots for the following year's officers, and planning/coordinating the MVMC Christmas Party
- 4. Writing the President's Corner article for the monthly Wright Roadster Newsletter.
- 5. Maintaining a good relationship with our sponsor, Jeff Schmitt Mazda, and encouraging members to consider purchasing cars, having service performed and buying parts there.

Shop Talk

It's not just about the Miatas By Roger Gordon




Shame on me for having no MIATA related content for you this month, but I do have some interesting car related stuff that you may find of value.

1. Here's a fun thing. Did you know you can rent other people's cars? Did you know you can rent out YOUR car if you want? There is a site called DRIVESHARE which will show you cars available in your area to rent – how about an old Thunderbird or a '97 Viper or a 1926 Model

T? All are available to rent. Cost – yep – not cheap, but

Model T is \$200 a day – that is reasonable for a photo shoot I suppose. I cannot image wanting to put my car here but hey – everyone is different. I have no idea what the requirements are, but if you wanted to recreate prom night for your sweetie in a 1958 T-bird, It's yours for \$400 a day. It is kind of fun to go to the site and see what is available in your area.



More non-Miata-related stuff:

- 2. If you worked on your own cars, pre-internet, and needed some specialized knowledge to fix your car, you went to the local library and checked out one of the Chilton Library books for your model (if it was not already checked out). Honestly, I had forgotten about these (much like the JC Whitney catalogue) but now the Hagerty Driver's Club is giving free access to the entire Chilton Library which is of course online and not hard copy. So if you happen to have a project car of the vintage variety, this might be a good source for you. Membership in the Driver's Club is \$85 annual and includes roadside service and some other benefits. The main reason I joined was to receive their excellent bi-monthly Hagerty Driver's Club magazine.
- 3. We forget, but in the old days ('50s for me) some cars still had 6-volt electrical systems. The advent of AC and power windows created the need for way more power, so all cars went to 12-volt systems which continues today for the Internal Combustion crowd. Just do not be surprised if you start seeing 48-volt systems coming down the road. I am seeing more and more talk of them on the way only to high-end cars initially, I suspect, but it will eventually trickle down to us commoners. So, get ready to throw away that 12-volt charger that most of us have in the garage.

TESLA anyone?

4. I wanted to see what the hoopla was about with the Tesla. Would I like it? Would I drive it? How does it all work? Figured I would get a used one – in case I did not care for it and had to sell it, I would not lose too much money. So, I found a newer reasonably priced USED one in Columbus and bought it. It was cheaper from having been in a rental fleet. At the time, it qualified for a \$4,000 tax credit – which made it even more reasonable. Previously, I would not have bought one because it was not suitable for long drives to remote places – however, our current lifestyle does not really allow that so the range became less important – and, if we did need a long trip, we could rent a non-EV vehicle or borrow one of our kid's cars. Anyway, long story short, I do love the Tesla Model 3 and love driving it. I've put 25K miles on it since last August when I bought it and have done zero maintenance. This week, I had some minor service done at the Tesla facility in Dayton, just to see how that works.

The service experience was as great as the car. I did have a 220V wall connector installed in our garage, so charging is easy when I remember to plug it in. The dollars paid for electricity to charge is way less than then dollars paid for gas – even though our previous vehicle was a hybrid. Bottom line – I like the Tesla Model 3 a lot and am thinking about upgrading to a newer one before the \$7,500 tax credit expires at the end of September 2025. If you have questions about Tesla, feel free to reach out or come over some time and drive ours if you want.

CARVANA

5. Just wanted to report that I have had two positive experiences with CARVANA. Our neighbor bought a car from CARVANA and had it delivered and reported a good experience. I never bought a car from them, but I have sold two with them. I was very happy with one sale (only time I ever "made money" on a sale) and was happy enough selling our Honda Accord. The process was pretty clean and simple – had to upload various photos of the vehicle. The person driving the truck to pick it up arrived on time – made sure the vehicle was "as described" and payment came quickly after that. I believe CARVANA received some negative press a few years ago – it had something to do with titles – which is sort of understandable since every single state has different title requirements and procedures. Expect to pay a little more than from a car lot for the whole CARVANA convenience of course.

SLATE

6. Did you know that AMAZON will be selling a truck soon? The truck will be a smaller (smaller than the old Ford Ranger) vehicle and EV only – no internal combustion engine. The base model is targeted to be

less than \$20,000. The truck will have many strange features and be configurable in many ways – it does not even come painted – it was designed to be "wrapped" – so you can change colors easily. If you want one of the first ones, you need to get your deposit in soon. I already sent in my \$50 deposit even though I have no idea if I want one. Just do a search for SLATE AMAZON EV TRUCK. This thing could be wild!



7. Final item – this just makes me laugh. The new Corvette ZR1 twin turbo has 1,064 horsepower. If you try to get away, you may not get as far as you think. If you happen to drive the ZR1 at wide open throttle, you will drain the 18.5-gallon gas tank in NINE minutes.
