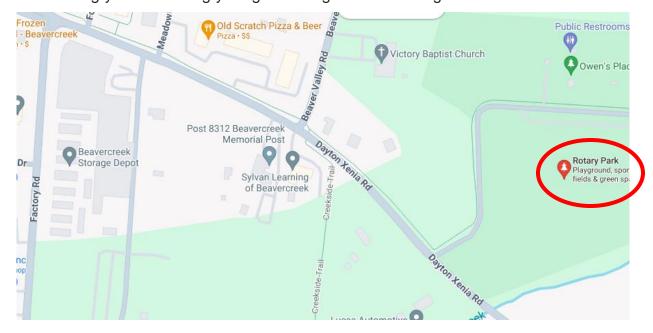

Shop Talk (It's not just about the cars)

Among the things many of us car lovers have in common is the fact that we tend to buy and sell more cars than the average person. I can also say that it is likely that most of us don't really enjoy the process of buying or selling, particularly selling. It is a very time-consuming process. It requires a great deal of hard work and patience to create a good selling document. Just determining what our vehicles are worth is enough to discourage many of us, and figuring out where to market your product can be daunting. Then, there are difficulties dealing with

potential buyers, safely collecting the money from the sale, arranging for the transport, etc., that can be overwhelming. As a result, even the most adventurous among us can easily decide to take the easy road out and just simply avoid the process.

I mention all of this because during the past few days while cruising the net, I accidently stumbled across a site that might be of interest to those of us who might be buying or selling a vehicle, particularly a classic or special-interest car like a Miata. I want to be clear that I have not used this service, so this is not a testimonial. I have scrutinized their offerings, and I am impressed. The name of the company is CLASSIC.COM. At its core, this site offers an easily searchable database of vehicles, either currently for sale or recently sold, at more than 250 dealers or auctions worldwide, all in one place. The database includes pictures and basic facts about a car, like where it was located, mileage, and options, as well as what it is currently listed or recently sold for. The search engine is easy to use, and predesigned reports and custom reports are impressive indeed. Also impressive is the list of automobiles that can be included in their database.

They advertise as follows:

- If you are a buyer, use their database to search for cars or follow the market
- If you are an owner, track the comps for your car
- If you are an auction or dealer, include your listings
- If you are a private seller, let them help you sell your car

Yes, you understood that last statement correctly: they have verified partners that will help you prepare, present, and sell your car. If the fees are not too high, it might well be worth it. If you ever think you might want to use any of the services that they offer, it would definitely be worth it to visit the CLASSIC.COM site to better understand their offerings. I was very impressed with the products that they offer.
