To aid in your decision to self-nominate, you should be willing to commit to the following responsibilities when you become President:


- 1. Coordinating Meet & Greet locations, ensuring venue can accommodate members and that it is a generally acceptable restaurant.

Shop Talk (It's not just about the cars)

This month, Susan Cain directed me to an article published by Autozone regarding gasoline stabilization. Since we are fast approaching that time of the year when many of us will be storing our Miatas for the winter, I thought it might be a good topic for Shop Talk. I wrote an article on this topic many years ago in which I recommended that if you were planning to store your car for between three and six months that it was not necessary to add a stabilizing agent to your gasoline. The author of this article disagrees with that. In fact, he plainly states

that gasoline has an expiration date of 30 days, even premium. Given that fact, he recommends that that you add stabilizer to the gas tank of any gasoline powered product that you are going to store for more than 30 days if you cannot drain the tank before storage. I have three cars and one driver. I believe that I have gasoline that is more than 30 days old most of the time. To the best of my knowledge, old gasoline has never been the source of a problem in any of my cars. However, over the years, I have had spring starting problems with lawn mowers and chain saws etc,. when I forgot to run them dry before storing them in the fall. All that said, in the face of new knowledge, I believe I would amend my previous advice by saying if you are going to store your Miata for more than three months you should consider adding stabilizer to your gasoline.

If you decide to be safe and add a stabilizer to your gasoline, you should know that most reputable brands will protect your car for 24 months. The good news is that adding stabilizer is a DIY friendly process. The first step is to drive your car until the gas tank is nearly empty. Then you open the tank and measure out the amount of stabilizer recommended by the manufacturer and pour it into the gas tank. At this point you will want to fill the tank with gasoline to minimize the chance that your fuel system is exposed to air or water (avoid gasoline containing ethanol if possible). At that point, you should start the engine and let it run for five to ten minutes. In most cases, a drive home from the gas station should be adequate to ensure that the stabilizer is evenly distributed though out the gas tank and fuel delivery system.

You are now done and set for up to 24 months of storage.


